We desire to build relationships with the leaders of the city so that we might have open doors of ministry in the city. Also, we feel this will give Pedro a good forum to get to know them better.

The Lord is truly providing all that we need for the trip. As the time draws nearer to departure, December 27, please pray that preparations go smoothly. Also, pray that the spiritual realm will be prepared for us to have an effectual door of ministry.

JESUS IS OUR PRAISE

For the past several weeks, we at LCF have been learning of praise. Beginning in 2 Chronicles Chapter 20, we have traced the story of Jehoshaphat, King of Judah, and his response to the advancing of a great multitude of enemy against the people of Israel.

The response of Jehoshaphat and his kingdom, through praise and worship, in the face of impending destruction has established for us a pattern of victory to be followed. An avenue of praise and worship waiting to be traveled lays before us. A vast treasurehouse of untapped riches in glory, in Christ Jesus, awaits us as we travel the high path of praise.

If you are in anyway like me, and I suspect you are, then you know that we have yet much to learn and a long way to go concerning praise. As we concentrate before the Lord to learn of Him, I have a great expectancy and hope that the Holy Spirit will turn on the lights for us and that we would see to walk in God's truth for us this hour.

Regarding praise, the Lord has placed some thoughts on my heart that I would like to share with you. First I would like to lay some groundwork and help to establish two concepts.

PRAISE IS A PERSON!

Praise in its purest form, in its highest realm is a person! Don't let this get by you; reach out in the spirit and lay hold of this truth. In psalms 148:14 it is recorded: "He also exalteth the horn of his people, the praise of all his Saints."

The word used for praise here in Ps. 148:14 is <u>hawlal</u>. It is a word we learned the meaning of a few Sundays ago.

Hawlal - Strong's 1984 - haw-lal; a prim. root; to be clear (orig. of sound, but usually of color): to shine: hence to make a show, to boast; and thus to be (clamorously) foolish; to rave; causat. to celebrate, commend, (deal, make), fool (-ish, -ly), glory, give (light), be (make, feign self) mad (against), give in marriage, (sing, be worthy of) praise, rage, renowned, shine.

We see that praise is a celebration, the making of a show, to be clamorously foolish, but also it is a shining, a giving of light and glory. This becomes increasingly important in light of Zacharias' prophecy in Chapter One of Luke's gospel.

As his father, Zacharias was filled with the Holy Ghost and prophesied, saying,

"Blessed be the Lord God of Isreal; for he hath visited and redeemed his people.

And hath raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David;...

Through the tender mercy of our God; whereby the dayspring from on high hath visited us,

To give light to them that sit in darkness, and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace. (Luke 1:67-69, 75-79)

Jesus <u>IS</u> the horn of salvation, He <u>IS</u> the horn of Psalm 148:14. He came to give light, to shine upon those who sit in dark-

ness. He <u>IS</u> the praise of all his saints!

Let's look at this another way. Who is our salvation--Jesus, who is our peace--Jesus, who is our healing--Jesus, who is our light--Jesus. Jesus is our all and in all. As we pursue Him to know Him fully, we begin to realize that He is more than just the object of our praise, He is our praise!

May I tell you something else, we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even being transformed; we are becoming praise!

Glory to God! A works oriented or legalistic mentality will not accomplish this miracle, only an impartation of grace working wholly through us by faith will bring it about. With all this in mind, let's continue:

PRAISE SHINES FROM ZION!

In Psalm 50:2, Asaph writes, "Out of Zion, the perfection of beauty, God hath shined." What is Zion? An understanding of it is crucial to the understanding of the Kingdom of God. First let's look at a definition of the word.

Zion - Strong's 6726 - tsee-yoon; the same (reg.) as 6725; Tsizon (as a permanent capital), a mountain of Jerus.: - Zion.

- Strong's 6725 - tseeyoon; from the same as 6723 in the sense of conspicuousness [comp. 5329]; a monumental or guiding pillar; - sign, title, waymark.

Zion - T.W.O.T. 1910 - Zion is the fortified mound between the Kidron and the Tyrapean Valleys that David captured from the Jebusites (II Sam. 5:7). Subsequently, it became known as the city of David. With the building of the temple to the north, that hill later became known as Mount

Zion. Zion may even refer specifically to the temple vicinity or more generally to Jerusalem itself; sometimes it included the entire nation, the covenant community itself (Isa. 1:27, Ps 97:8). It seldom refers to the political capital of Judah, but much more often stands for the city of God in the new age.

Simply and practically speaking, Zion, the City of God, is where the throne of God is eternally established. Zion is the dwelling place of God. Zion is where the tabernacle rests in peace, where praise is made perfect, it is the hope of the destitute and groaning prisoner. In Zion, the Lord is known in greatness. (Ps. 2:6, 87:5, 9:11, 9:14, 65:1, 99:2, 102:16-22, 20:2)

Zion is the source of strength and support for the people of God; it is a place of being in God; it is righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit. Zion is the Kingdom of God coming forth in the fullness of glory.

Folks, we are the temple of God (I Cor 3:16); we are being built together into a dwelling of God in the Spirit (Eph. 2:22). We are living stones being built up as a spiritual house for a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Christ Jesus (1 Pet. 2:5). As we choose to praise God, (spiritual sacrifice), we magnify Him and not our situation. God sits enthroned on our praises (Ps. 22:3). He who is praise begins to shine forth and we are changed in the midst of our circumstance.

A great confidence comes from knowing that the one who indwells us is a great and mighty King. In fact, He is the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords, the Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus is the Lion of the tribe of Judah, (Judah means praise); there is a roaring Lion of praise who is seeking to fill His people with all that He is. From the depth of our inner man (Jn.

7:38) this King of praise is shining forth with light, and steadily, ever so surely (Isa. 28:10), the purifying heat (Heb. 12:29) of His ever present light is expanding outward until one day (2Pet. 1:19) spirit, soul, and body (I Thes. 5:23) we totally glow with His everlasting glory forevermore (2 Cor. 3:9, Matt 17:2).

Church, this is for us now! We must begin to walk in this today. Put on your walking shoes and don't worry about the soles wearing out, your feet are shod with good news and your soul will find rest upon the way (Heb. 4:7-9, Isa. 52:7, Eph 6:15). Don't say this is for another time (after death, the Millennial Kingdom) or another people (the natural Jew only); it is for us today. Kingdom of God is a present reality and Zion is spreading, without observation (Luke 17:20, 21), over the face of the whole earth. Praise shines from Zion and we are becoming His praise!

We can either facilitate or hinder the establishment of the

old; the rod of thine inheritance, which thou has redeemed; this mount Zion, wherein thou has dwelt.

Lift up thy feet unto the perpetual desolations; even all that the enemy hath done wicked in the sanctuary.

Thine enemies roar in the midst of thy congregations; they set up their ensigns for signs. (Ps. 74:2-4)

We noted earlier that Zion is a guiding pillar, a sign, title, or waymark. Only Jesus should be lifted up in Zion, as He is lifted up all men shall be drawn to Him (Jn. 12:32). Only the roar of the King of praise should be heard in Zion but the enemy has come in and desecrated the sanctuary (you are the temple). He has roared in our midst and set up his own signs for signs.

We would do well to heed the Holy Spirit inspired words of the Apostle Paul and "Cast down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bring into

Kingdom of God by the choices we make. The right response to every circumstance helps to establish the Kingdom (righteousness, peace, joy) in and around us, the wrong response only prolongs the darkness. To choose for the Kingdom's sake is an act of our will; God gives the grace, but we must choose to walk in it. Our will is affected by our attitudes, thoughts, and imaginations. In all this we need the mind of Christ.

The Psalmist declares:

"Remember thy congregation, which thou has purchased of captivity every thought to the obedience to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5). Remember that "we wrestle not against flesh and blood" (EPh. 6:12), not even our own, and begin to praise God for the victory. God has given us a mighty arsenal to use against the enemy. Praise is one of our weapons and it is not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds (2 Cor. 10:4). Use it! May your praise shine and may darkness flee.

ARISE, SHINE; for thy light is come, and the glory of the Lord is risen upon thee!

Training your children to be wise

"Listen, my sons, to a father's instruction; pay attention and gain understanding. I give you sound learning, so do not forsake my teaching. When I was a boy in my father's house, still tender, and an only child of my mother, he taught me and said, "Lay hold of my words with all your heart; keep my commands and you will live. Get wisdom, get understanding; do not forget my words or swerve from them. Do not forsake wisdom, and she will protect you: love her, and she will watch over you. Wisdom is supreme; therefore get wisdom." Proverbs 4:1-7a

My four children, Matthew, Karen, Stephen and Susanna are teaching me about being a father.

This proverb shows a biblical father's desire to build wisdom into his son. I hope I can skillfully build wisdom into my children's life.

"The essential idea of hakam (wisdom) represents a manner of thinking and attitude concerning life's experiences; including matters of general interest and basic morality. These concerns relate to prudence in secular affairs, skills in the arts, moral sensitivity, and experience in the ways of the Lord." (Theological Wordbook of the Old Testament)

So, what I have in mind for my kids is building into them a manner of thinking which relates life's experiences to God and His Kingdom. Specifically, I am interested in building prudence in their working habits, developing skills and gifts, as well as nurturing good moral fiber.

That simply means that everything I allow the kids to do at this point in their lives should be seen in light of what I want them to become.

For example: Sports is a big thing in America. Thinking ahead, I knew there would be a time when Matthew would become interested. So, I had to view sports as it related to what I wanted to build into my son. I chose to let him get involved in soccer for several reasons.

First, I see soccer as the international sport. Almost every nation plays soccer. I want Matthew to have a view towards other nations. If he knows a little bit about soccer, it will be much easier for him to relate to Latin Americans or Europeans, as well as Africans and Asians.

Also, LYSA allows parents to be very involved with their children in the coaching and general running of the team. As a matter of fact, it worked out that I could serve as assistant coach during Matthew's time in soccer thus far.

During practices and games, I could encourage Matthew to develop an attitude of serving and love while learning to be assertive and disciplined.

But this is just one example of how we view everything in light of how it fits into the overall vision. The friends our children choose, the toys they have, the vacations we take all relate to building the Kingdom.

THE BIG PICTURE

It makes it very difficult to determine what is best for your child if you do not have some type of overall vision and goal for his life. For Matthew, I have the specific goal of him being the director of our CTS in the year 2000, the year he graduates.

The CTS is aimed at training young men and women in character, discipline, and Biblical principles, as well as bring them forth in their gifts and skills. As a whole, it helps students work toward flowing in the body of Christ as servants and friends. In order for Matthew to be the director, he will need to have these areas worked into his life. So, I can systematically prepare him for this goal over the next eleven years.

Of course Matthew will probably never really be the director. It is something I will prepare him for. If at that time he does not feel that this fits in with God's plan for his life, that will be fine. What is being built into his life will be transferable to any area.

Bob Trolese told me about a little child that was brought to them at the orphanage in Nicaragua. The mother had left it in a box until he was three years old. As a result, he was greatly retarded in many areas. He could not function physically or mentally like a three year old.

In the same way, I do not want to put my children in "the box of my own expectations". I want to have a general plan that

will build into them what they will need in order to do what they find God calling them to do.

As for now, I am building one stone at a time in the areas of skills, gifts, character, morality, and a general understanding of God and the Scriptures.

DIAGRAM

In order to keep a clear picture before my eyes of what I am wanting to build into my children's lives, I have developed a diagram for each one which represents what I am trying to work on during any specific period. (See diagram on right)

At the bottom of the diagram, I have a code which identifies the different training points.

DON'T SWEAT THE DETAILS

Many times when I see a diagram such as this, I think "No way, I could never do all of this!" I feel the same way about my own diagram. I approach it open ended without feeling pressured to make it all happen.

Periodically, I view the diagram to see how I am doing. As I find time, I work on areas that are in need, and often I have to choose to let some things go without feeling guilty.

The idea of a plan is to get you moving in the right direction. Then, you make adjustments according to the restraints that present themselves.
