Wrong Question -

Which Bible School?

LCF offers many opportunities for training; All are based on the biblical pattern of church

We have several avenues of training at LCF. Here is an explanation of some of them.

BIBLE SCHOOL

The LCF Bible School is organized to give opportunity for deeper study of the word of God. Through LCFBS a student can cover the same material that would be covered in a traditional Bible school while being actively involved in the local church.

The material covered over a four year period would be:

- ■OT and NT surveys
- ■Studies of 3-4 NT sections
- ■Studies of 3-4 OT sections

The classes run concurrently with UK semesters and are taught Monday nights from 7:00-8:30. The book of Acts will begin in the middle of January.

FOUNDATIONS MANUAL

Every member of the body is strongly urged to go through the foundations manual. It is taught on a one-to-one basis and covers three basic areas: 1)knowing God's extension of grace to the individual through salvation, 2)understanding how we relate to God through worship, prayer, and the word, and 3)understanding how we relate to the church and the world.

These are the basic teachings all Christians need. A person is not ready to go on to other teaching until these areas have begun to be worked into his or her life..

If you have not been tutored through a manual, please see your home fellowship pastor. He will help find someone to go through the lessons with you.

SPECIAL TRAINING

Most people do not know about special training classes that are offered to people expressing a desire to grow in ministry. As individuals in the body express a desire to grow in a certain area, we offer personal training in that area.

Right now we have training sessions in evangelism, pastoring, and servanthood. If you need special training, contact Billy.

THE CHURCH

By far the most important aspect of training is everything that goes on in the daily life of the church. Beyond the classes, every interaction in the church is training. The best training program is living your life out with other people (See article on this page entitled "Which Bible School?").

As we continue to develop areas of training we must see each area as an extenstion of the church. For instance, the goal of the foundations manual is not to get people through a curriculum. The purpose is to build people in their ability to know God and walk together with others.

Home Schooling

Home Schoolers Better Educated Nationally; Parental Involvement is the Key

Two concerns of home schooling parents are whether or not their children are getting a good academic education and if they are receiving proper socialization.

The August 12 Christianity Today gave an encouraging assessment in an article entitled "The Kitchen classroom."

According to the article, home schoolers are reported by a number of states as scoring equal to or higher than students in the public system on standardized tests. The state education departments of Tennessee, Oregon, Washington, and Alaska are cited as reporting their home schoolers as scoring better on their tests. Additional independent research has arrived at the same conclusion.

Although socialization is not as easy to measure, available empirical data stack up in favor of home education. The Christianity Today article sights studies by various authorities which affirm the socialization process of home schoolers.

One observation is suggested. "Home school parents, the large majority of whom appear to be evangelical Christians, obviously hold a special interest in their children's development. They are willing to make great personal sacrifices for their children's total growth and development—academic, social, and spiritual. Given the parental support and commitment they experience at home, it may be that these home-educated children would have done just as well, academically and socially, in conventional schools."

If this is the case, then those parents who put their children in public or private schools can achieve the same positive results through committed involvement with the child's learning process.

One definite advantage to home schooling did surface through a study by psychologist Mona Moarse Delahooke. "Home educated children appeared to be less peer oriented than those in schools. (Children from private schools exhibited a significantly greater focus on peers and nonfamily individuals. This finding tends to confirm that home schooling may...reduce the influence of peer pressure."

LCF Goes Underground

Saturday, November 5, members of the church will be exploring a wild cave in Jessamine Gorge.

Groups from the church have been on this expidition in the past and have always seen it as a highlight of their year.

The time spent in the cave is 5-6 hours. It begins with about a 150 yard crawl through a tight vertical passageway. This crawl is especially interesting because of the undergound stream which flows through it.

At the end of the crawl, three different horizontal shafts offer themselves as relief. The third, which is the one usually taken by groups, is two 15 foot climbs. The first climb is through the small waterfall that feeds the stream.

At the top of the shaft, another vertical passageway appears. It is larger and goes in two directions. One direction leads you back into a stream. You can wade up this stream for about 45 minutes and you find a larger cavern with a beautiful miniature water fall that has created a small bath in the solid rock below.

On the other hand, you could go the other direction in this vertical tunnel and find what no one from LCF has never seen.

After the walk through this part of the cave you are dried and warm. Then you return to the horizontal descent to be reinvigorated by the falling water and crawl home.

Mike Dukakis-Favors federal funding of abortion. Opposed to prayer in schools. Favors homosexuals serving as foster parents.

STATE REPRESENTATIVE

Arbogast-Very strong activist in pro-life activities. Supports voluntary school prayer.

Scorsone-Actively supports legislation favoring homosexual activity. Is pro-abortion.

U.S. CONGRESS

Hopkins-Votes conservative, but could be stronger.

Patton-Politically liberal in moral, family issues.
